As you watch **Inherit the Wind** (1960), consider the following questions. Write down specific observations so you are prepared to discuss these ideas in class.

- 1. How are Christians or fundamentalists portrayed in the film?
- 2. How are agnostics or supporters of evolution portrayed in the film?
- 3. How is truth defined/characterized in the film?
- 4. What does the film say about the relationship between religion and science?
- 5. What does the film say about the relationship between faith and reason?

6. Tap into your affective domain (your emotional side!) Using three carefully chosen adjectives, express how you *feel* at the end of the film then speculate on why you feel that way.

As you watch **Expelled** (2008) consider the following questions. Write down specific observations so you are prepared to discuss these ideas in class.

- 1. *Inherit the Wind* pitted Christians (equated with fundamentalists) against supporters of evolution (equated, generally, with agnostics or atheists). What two "sides" are pitted against each other in *Expelled*?
- 2. How is each side portrayed or characterized?
- 3. Why do you think the film steers away from fundamentalist or overtly Christian characterizations of intelligent design proponents?
- 4. How is truth defined/characterized in the film?
- 5. In what ways are appeals to emotion utilized in this film? Do you think they are appropriate? Do you think they are effective?
- 6. In what ways is *Expelled* similar to *Inherit the Wind*? In what ways is it dissimilar?
